Then and Now

Percy Orton was the son of Dr. Darius Orton. He was born in Fish House in 1871 and was raised in the house up on Shew Hill, where the Newton's now live. Percy worked at General Electric, but he was very involved in this community. He was the town historian and was also on the Broadalbin School Board. The Presbyterian Church (the brick church just up Fish



House Rd on the right) closed its doors in 1917. Percy and his wife, Margaret (Rhodes) bought the church's parsonage (which is the white building to the right of the church) several years later and lived in it. They then built a small building next to it on the corner of Fish House Rd and CR 110 and turned it into a small store.

They sold gas and bait and rented out boats. They also sold refreshments and candy.

Percy would organize large fishing parties out of NYC. His fishing guide, Stubb Mussen would take them out onto the lake. Stubb caught a huge northern pike one year and Percy had

it stuffed and it hung on the wall of the store. It was reported to be the largest one ever caught.



Today the store (now used as a work shop) is owned by Dr. Detweiler and his and his wife Arden. They live across the street in the brick house. This summer, their son, Sam, is busy scrapping off the old paint and painting it.

Percy Orton would sell ice (that he cut out of the lake) in his store. He would store the ice in his ice house which is located just south of the corner of Fish House Rd and CR 110.

Percy Orton died in 1949.
