Bob Pickering allowed Hagaman two hits in the first inning and then blanked the visitors the rest of the way. George Stead handled the catching.

Dick Seeley led the hitting attack against Hagaman's Clark, smashing two doubles. Clark allowed four hits, walked two and fanned three. Pickering struck out 11 and issued no walks.
